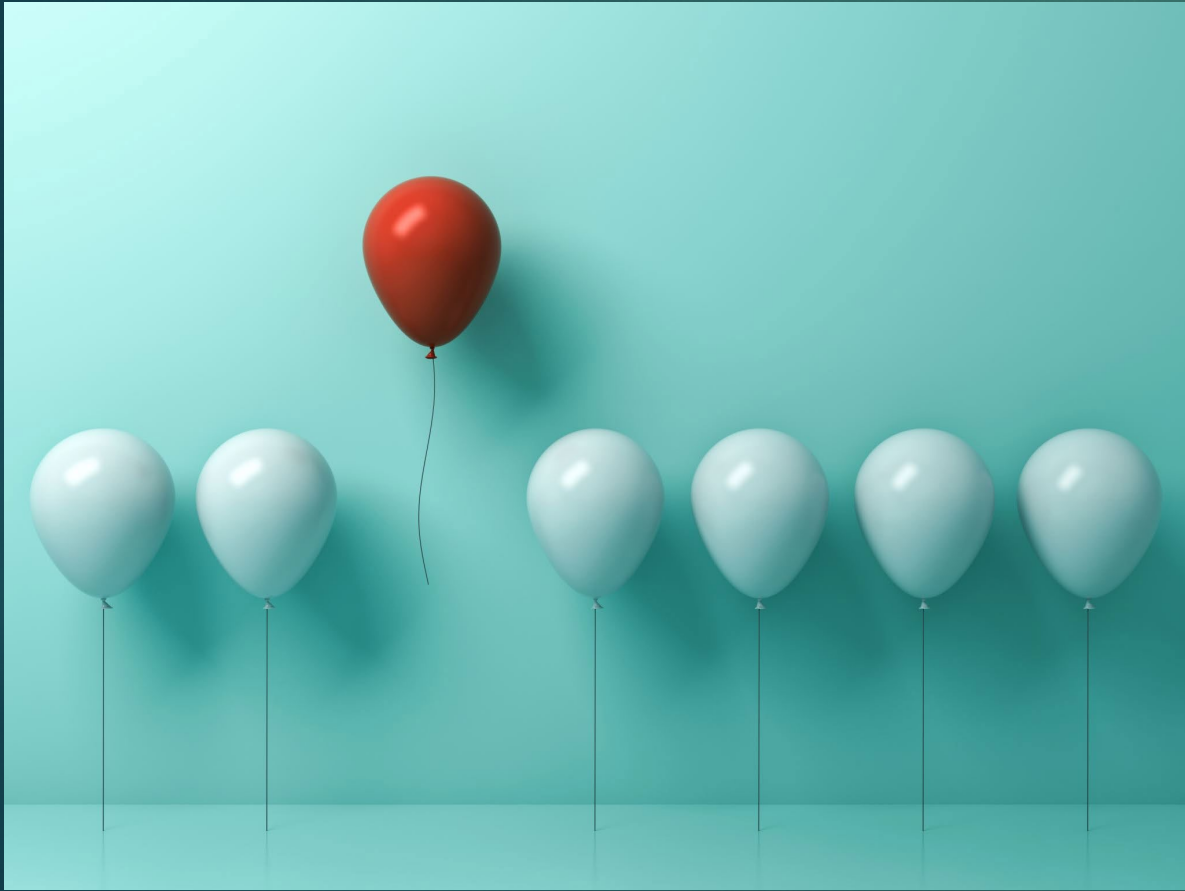
A category or class of works which share a set of conventions

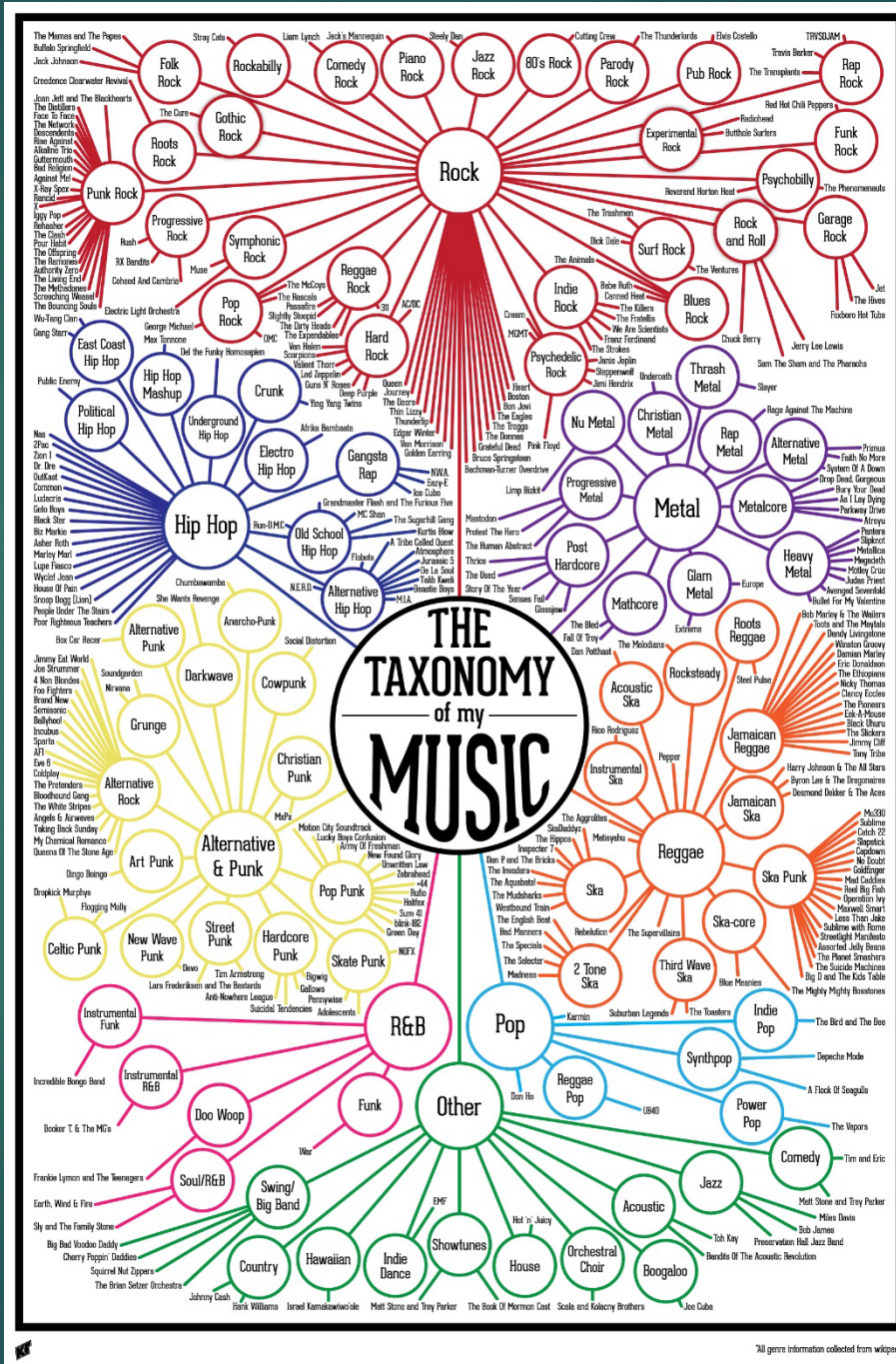

# NOIR

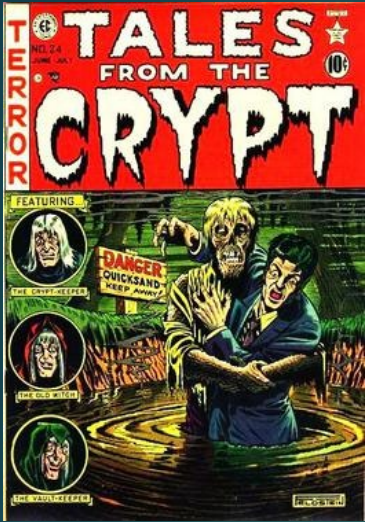
- Protagonist: detective/private eye
  - Fedora and trench coat
  - Constant smoking
  - Morally compromised/remorseful
  - Underworld contacts
  - Internal monologue
- Setting: urban, rainy, shadowy
- Plot: murder/blackmail, betrayal, flashbacks
- Themes: corrupt society

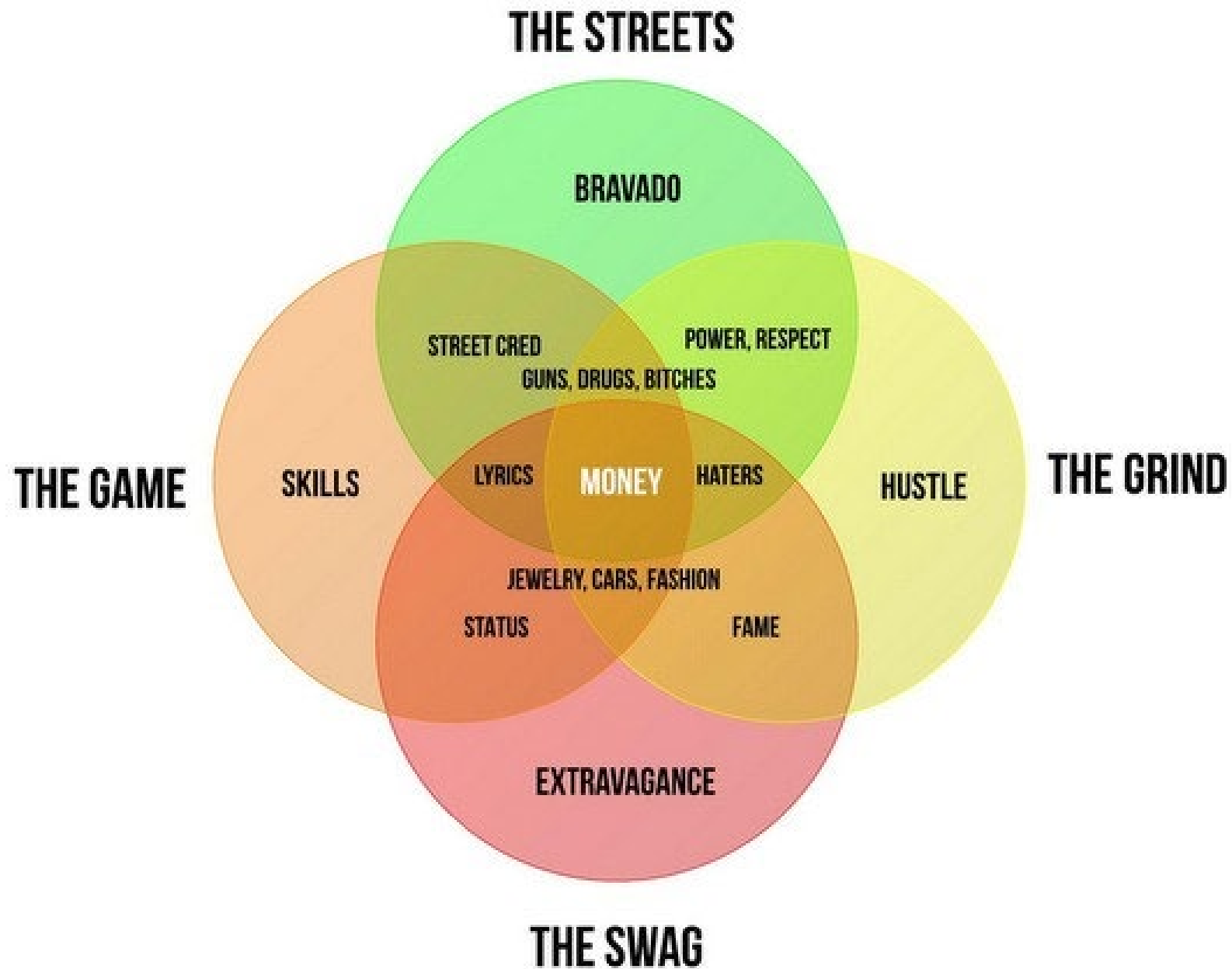

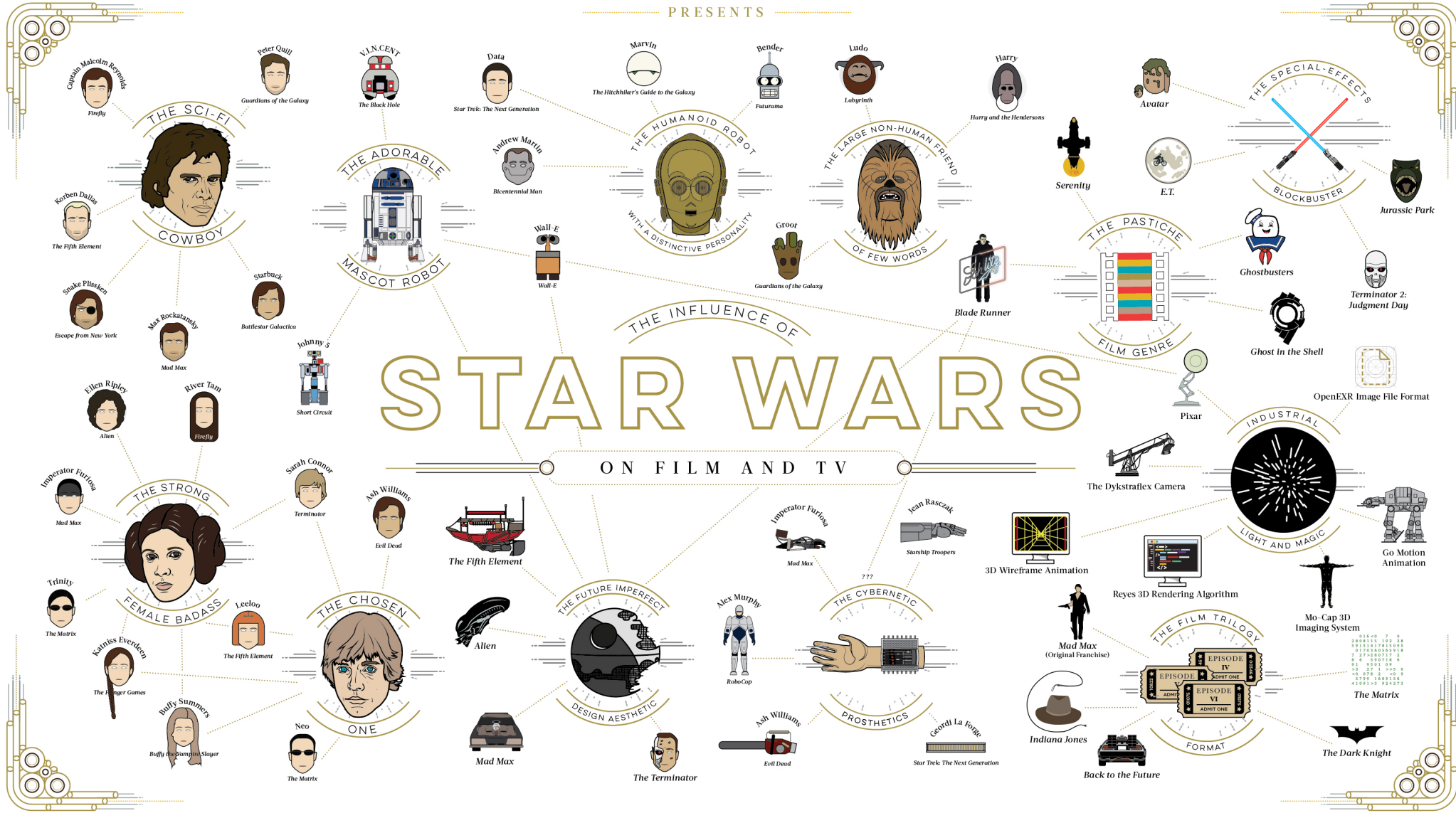
