
HERMAN MELVILLE



- 1819-1891
- Born in New York
- Dutch Calvinist family
- Both grandfathers fought in the American Revolution
- Worked as a sailor
- Part of the "American Renaissance"

SEAFARING EXPERIENCE

- January 1841: Melville sails from New Bedford on the "Acushnet"
- July 1842: Melville deserted in the Marquesas, exoticizing life on the volcanic islands in *Typee* (1846)
- Omoo (1847) fictionalized Melville's participation in a mutiny on the "Lucy Ann" whaleship and escape from jail in Tahiti
- Back in Nantucket, Melville joined the "Charles & Henry" as a harpooner, which he left in Hawaii in 1843
- October 1844: Melville returns to land to begin writing

Melville's fatherin-law Judge Lemuel Shaw upheld the constitutionality of the Fugitive Slave Act (1850)




OR THE WHITE WHALE OF THE PACIFIC: A LEAF FROM A MANUSCRIPT JOURNAL.

We expected to find the island of Santa Maria still more remarkable for the luxuriance of its vegetation, than even the fertile soil of Mocha; and the disappointment arising from the unexpected shortness of our stay at the latter place, was in some degree relieved, by the prospect of our remaining for several days in safe anchorage at the former. Mocha lies upon the coast of Chili, in lat. 38° 28' south, twenty leagues north of Mono del Bonifacio, and opposite the Imperial river, from which it bears w. s. w. During the last century, this island was inhabited by the Spaniards, but it is at present, and has been for some years, entirely deserted. Its climate is mild, with little perceptible difference of temperature between the summer and winter seasons. Frost is unknown on the lowlands, and snow is rarely seen, even on the summits of the loftiest mountains.


Named for Mocha Island off the Chilean coast, Mocha Dick was a real albino sperm whale, slain by whalers in 1838. Jeremiah Reynolds related the story in *The Knickerbocker* in 1839





Example of a Folio Gathering



Folios would be inserted within each other to form, for example, gatherings of 8 leaves (above). Gatherings are sewn through the central fold prior to binding the book. Multiple gatherings are stacked and made into a book.




